Assesment methods:

During the semester students preparing the seminar paper on a given topic, which will be assessed max. 60 points. Credit will not be awarded to a student who during the semester does not surrender prepared seminar papers. Finally evaluation: verbal exam, seminar paper. Assessment A - 94-100 points, Assessment B - 86 - 93 points, Assessment C - 76-85 points, Assessment D - 66-75 points, Assessment E - 56-65 points.

Learning outcomes of the course unit:

The student is advise with philosophical thinking as the solution of philosophical problems. In the example chosen (ontological, epistemological, axiological, methodological, etc.) problems of philosophy students acquire knowledge about the solution of philosophical problems in different historical stages of development philosophy from different philosophical positions. During the implementation of these goals, students learn elementary philosophical terminology and familiar with the most important historical events and personalities of philosophical thought.
