<b>Assessment methods:</b> <i>student's independent performance, presentation of homework, use knowledge of Slovak and German language, grouping knowledge, illustrative teaching</i> <i>Students will be writing 2 tests (each test 50 points). They will obtain 100 points per semester: for acquisition A it is necesery 94 – 100 points, for acquisition B it is necesery 88 – 93 points, for acquisition C it is necesery 82 – 87 points, for acquisition D it is necesery 76 – 81 points, for acquisition E it is necesery 70 – 75 points, for acquisition Fx less than 70 points.</i> <i>Students who obtain less than 35 points in one test, will not obtain any credits.</i> <i>Students are able to apply previons knowledge in the process of further acquisition learning.</i>
